

Preparing your home for photography

De-Clutter!

- Pack up “knick-knacks”.
- Clear unnecessary items from horizontal surfaces. Pay special attention to kitchen and bathroom benches. Also take any magnets etc off the front of the fridge.
- Ensure children’s toys are neatly stacked away.
- Clear away shampoo bottles etc from showers for the day of photography also make sure showers are nice and clean especially glass walls and doors.



Dress up the rooms

- Towels in bathrooms look great folded neatly, put bathmats away.
- Bed coverings should be crinkle free.
- Curtains look better when they are neatly opened.
- Blinds appear neater when set to the same tilt degree.
- Vacuum through, check for cobwebs.

Lighting

Although our professional photographer brings special lighting equipment, we also turn lights on in the house.

- Make sure that light bulbs are in working order - don’t forget bedside lamps and the kitchen rangehood.



Outside is just as important as inside



- Ensure that the lawns have recently been mowed and are looking their best.
- If you have an outdoor sun umbrella, put it up.
- Collect and remove loose leaves from around the garden (especially in Autumn).
- Sweep paths, clear any clutter.
- Wipe down glass outdoor tables.
- Put away the hose and move BBQ if you have one to a prime position if in good order or move away if looking a bit tatty.
- Tidy any outdoor pots.
- Water blast if necessary any mouldy areas.

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
